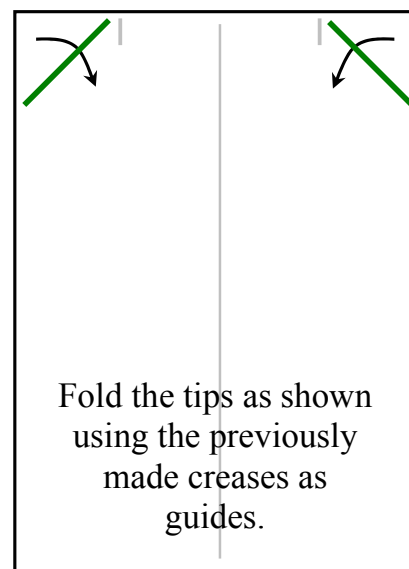
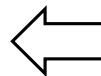
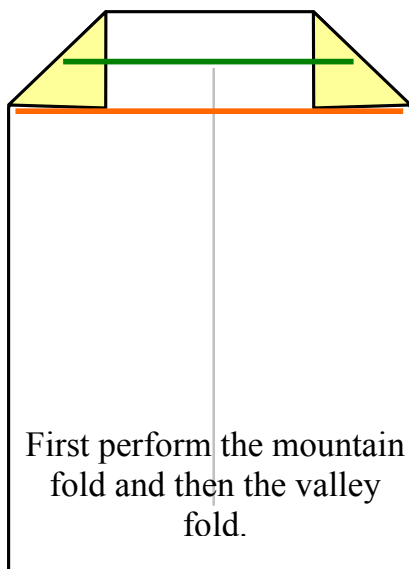
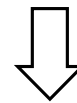
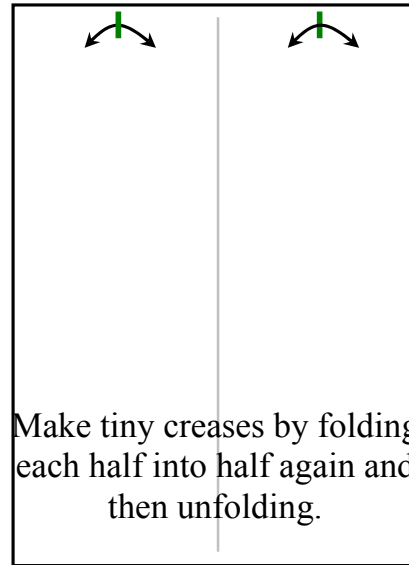
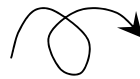
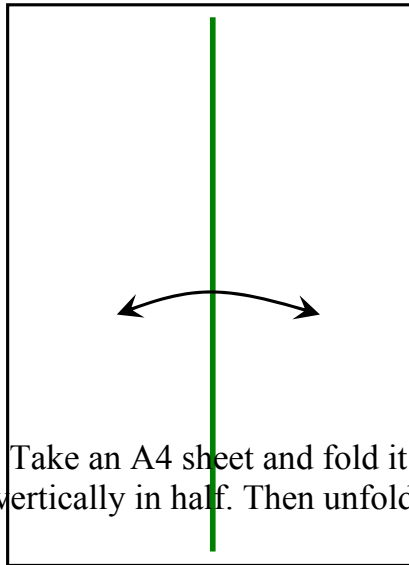
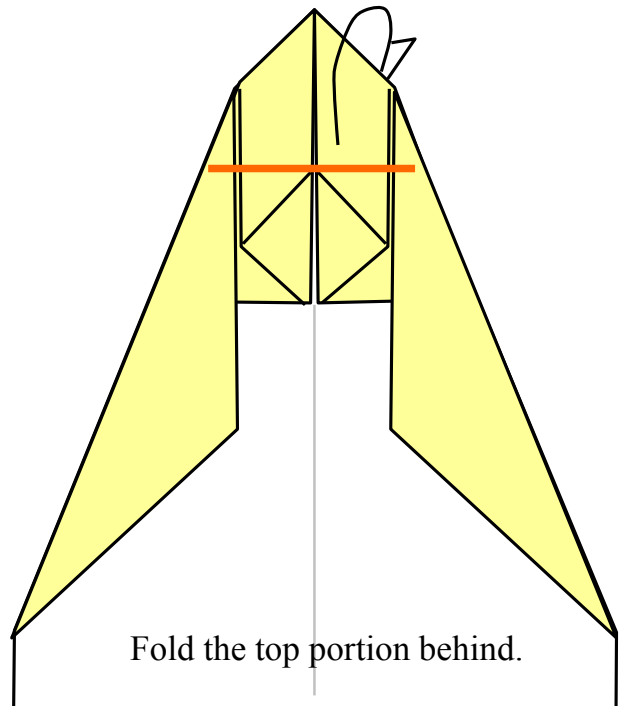
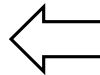
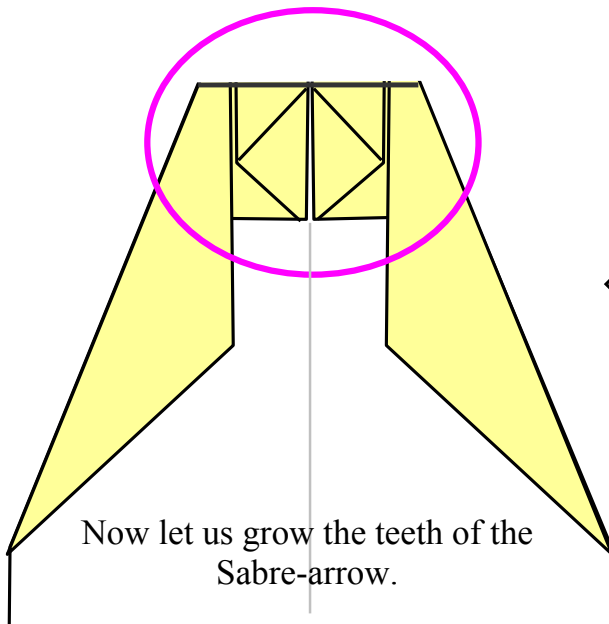
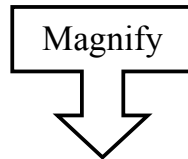
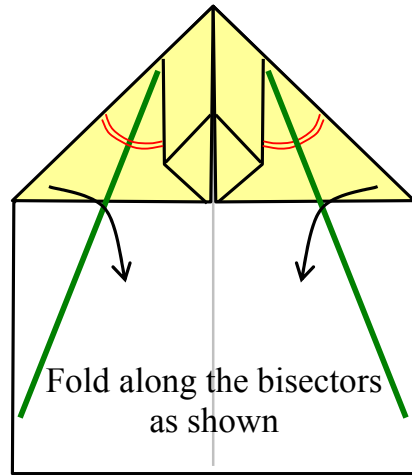
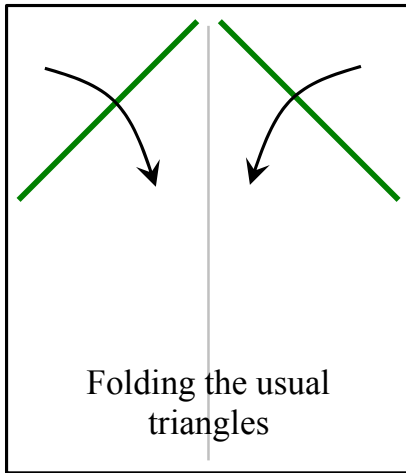
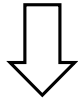
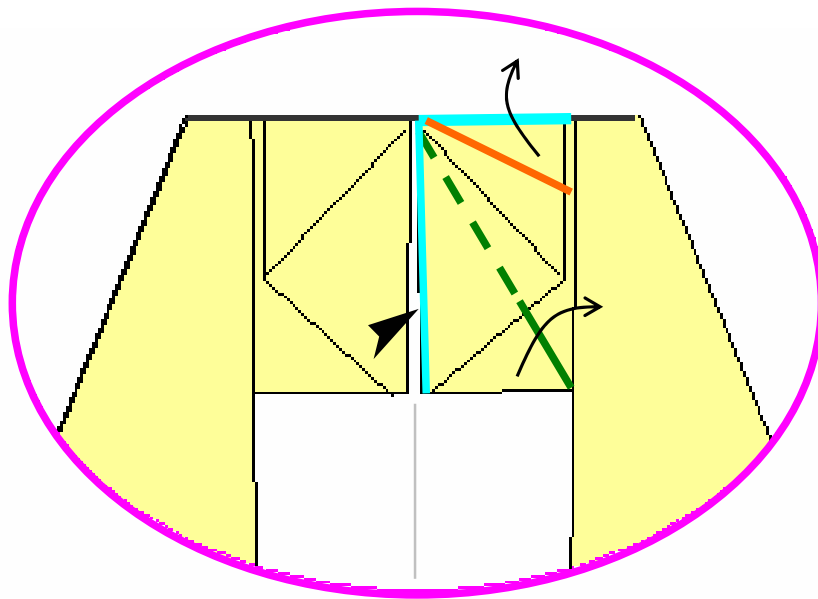


Folding the Sabre-arrow in 9 easy steps

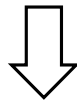


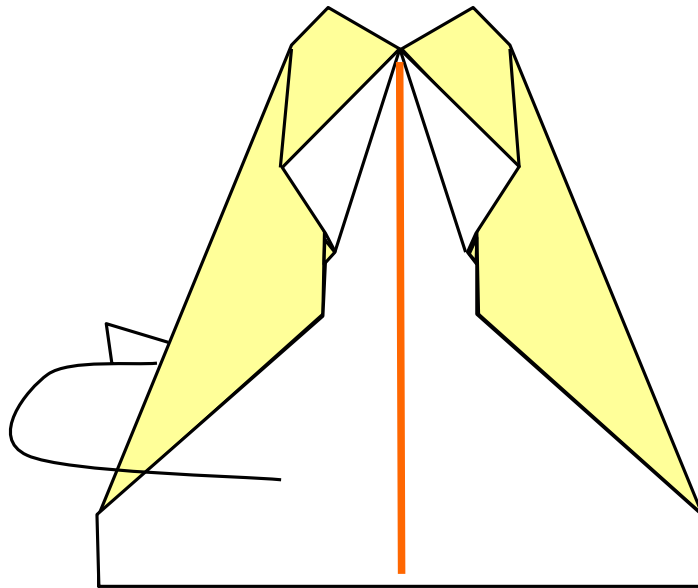

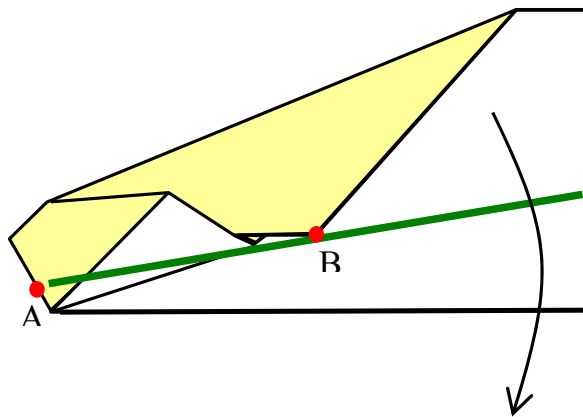
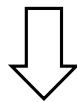


This is the tooth step. Push along the solid black wedge. Notice the unfold lines and how the valley fold becomes dashed in a particular region. Apart from growing a tooth, this step serves to lock the flaps located at the sides.
Repeat the same for the left-wing.

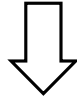




Mountain fold the whole plane in half.



Now fold the wings by folding along AB. Note that point A is about half a centimeter from the base of the plane and that B is a vertex point. Symmetrically fold the other wing.



This is the front view of the plane. Notice that only a slight dihedral is enough.

The Sabre-arrow not only looks like an arrow but also flies like one. If your plane tends to nose-dive try curving the wingtips upward.
