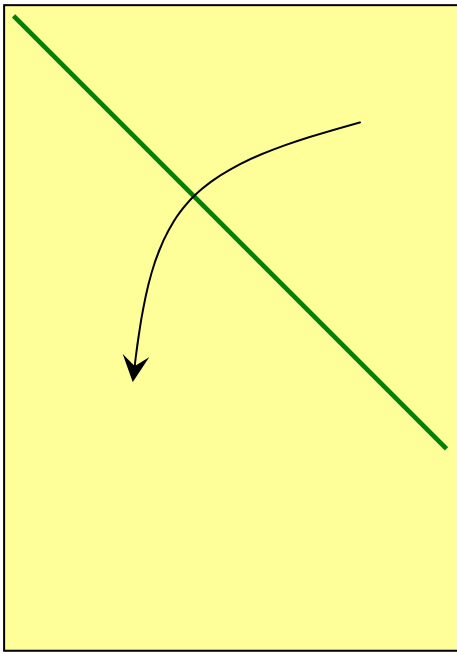
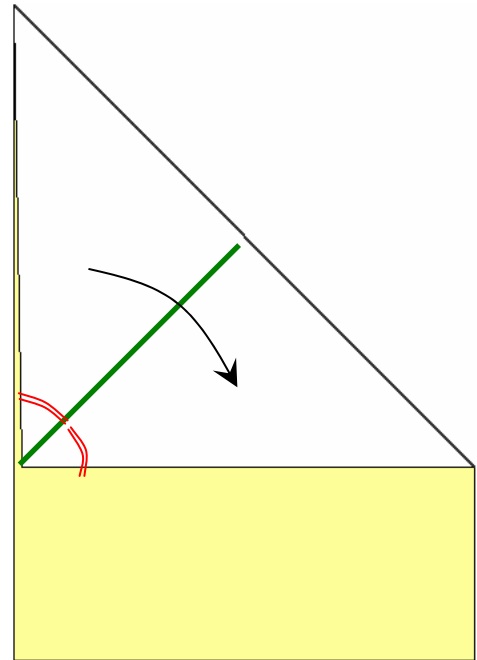
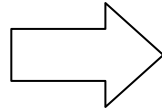


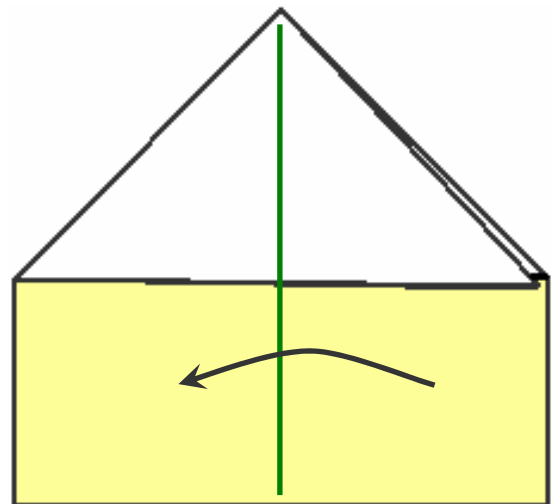
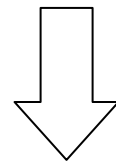
Folding the Sabre-ravi in 9 easy steps



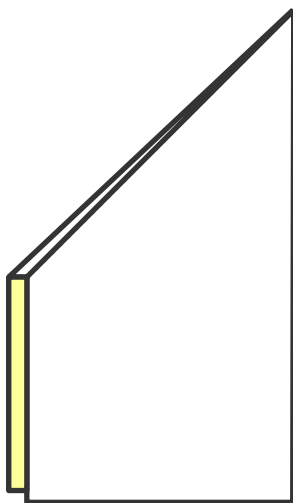
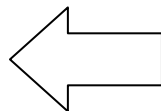
Take an A4 sheet and fold the top edge onto the left edge.



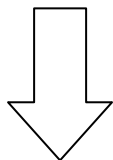
Fold along the bisector as shown.

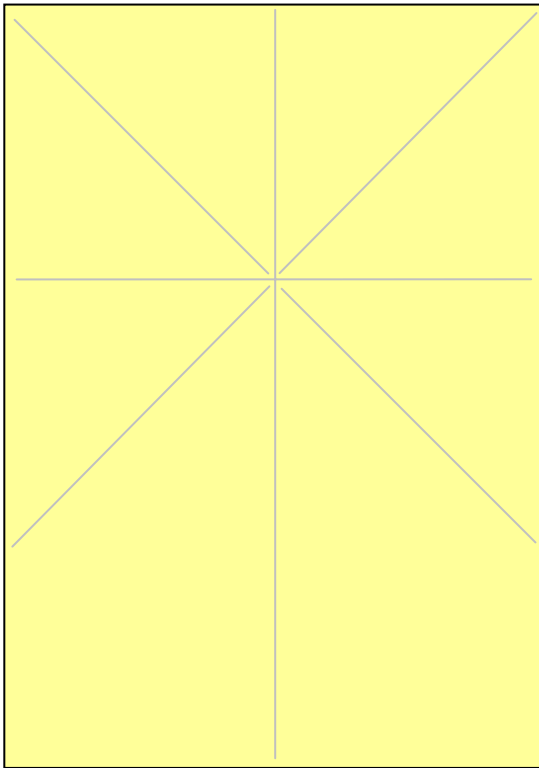


Fold the model in half

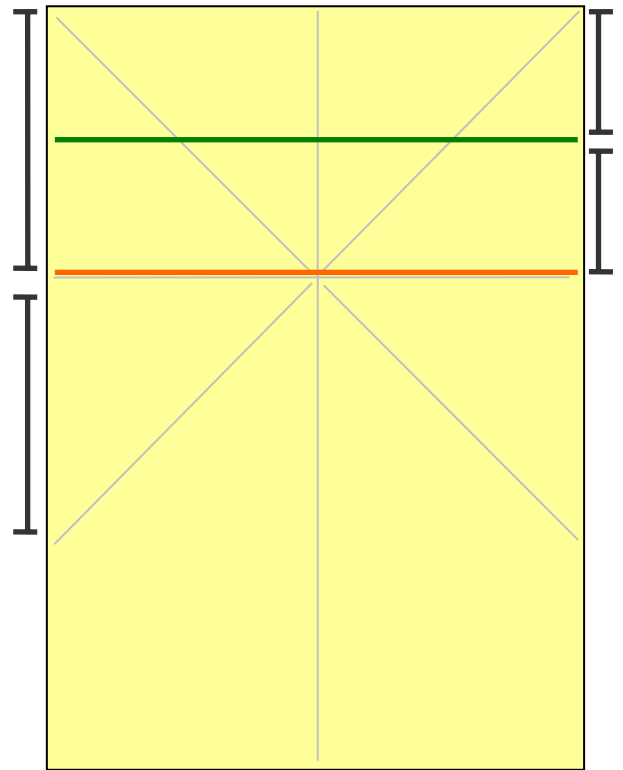
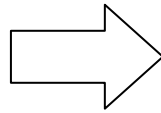


Now open up all the folds to get the original A4 sheet

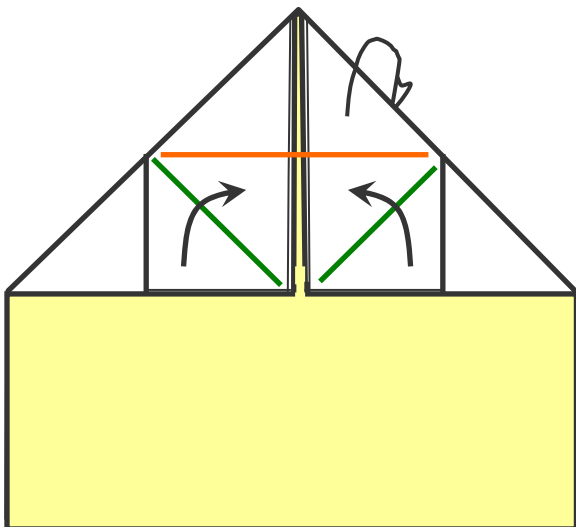
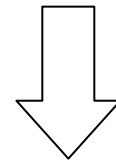




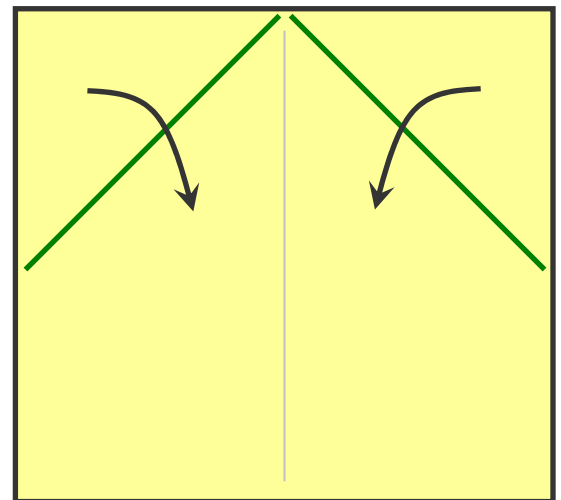
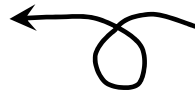
These are the creases that were made. They will go a long way in folding our plane



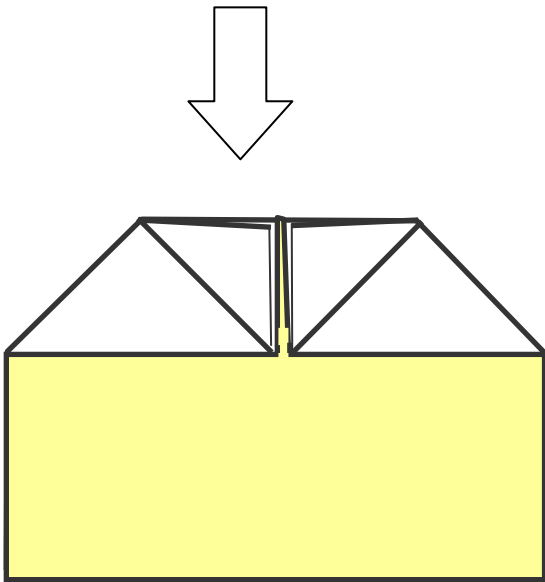
Fold as shown



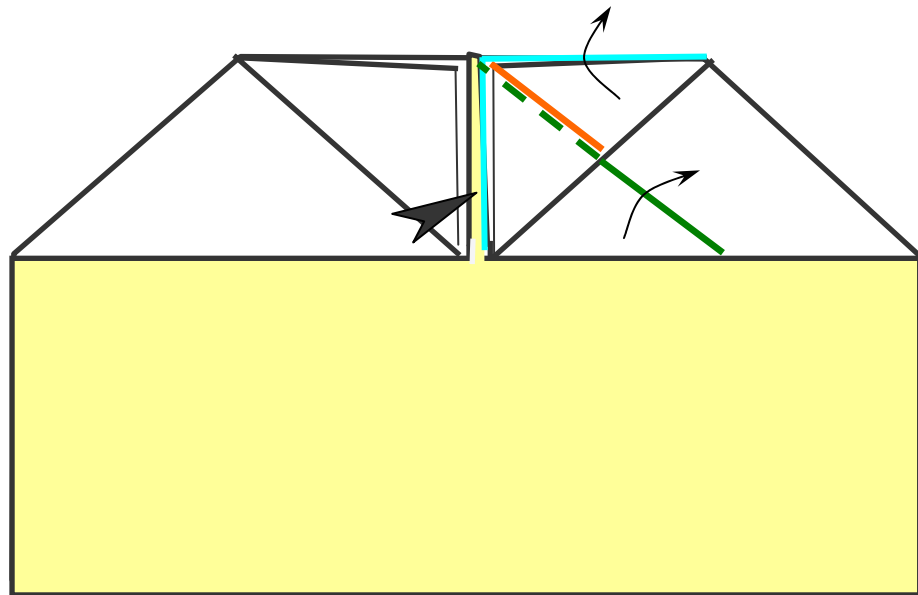
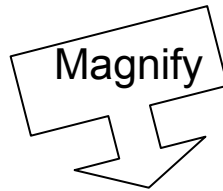
Fold the top 1/4th backward. Also valley fold the flaps as shown.



Fold the usual triangles and then flip turn the model over.

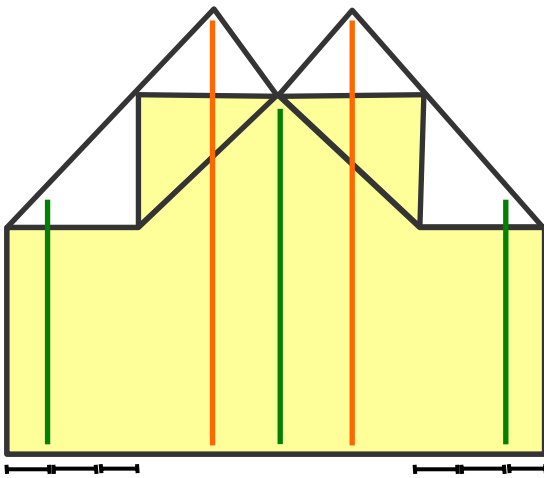
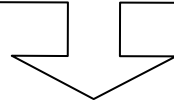


Now let us grow the teeth



Push along the solid black wedge. Unfold the blue lines. The green line becomes dotted showing that the valley fold is on the flap below the one seen on the top. As a guide, the vertical blue line should fall on the horizontal blue line.

Front View

Round off the Saber-ravi as shown on the left. To fly the Saber-ravi make sure the front view looks like the one shown on the right. The Sabre-ravi has a heavier front than the normal Sabertooth. So it can be thrown higher.

Just like the normal Sabertooth, it can either be thrown gently as a glider or can even be thrown hard.
